Start where you are

Nothing seems to have caused more upset over recent months than the meeting in the Oval Office between the President of the United States (and his entourage) and the President of Ukraine. Personally, I found it very painful to watch, but what can I do? Perhaps we are too often left in total frustration or helpless anger as world-shaping news seeps into the security of our living rooms. Here's the good news: Just because you can't change everything doesn't mean you can't change anything.

When I was a curate in Bristol Diocese, the former Archbishop of York, Stuart Blanch, visited the curates and asked how many of us were working in large parishes. Many of us dutifully raised our hands. He said, "Just because you can't visit everybody doesn't mean that you can't visit anybody." That principle is true in a number of areas of life. Just because you cannot bring peace to the Middle East or to Ukraine, does not mean that you cannot work for peace in your family, or amongst your work colleagues, or in your community, or even in your church. Start where you are.

When Jesus left his disciples, he told them to begin changing the world where they were (in Jerusalem) and then move on from there, to the ends of the earth. That's great advice. Start where you are. In the 6th Century BC, the Chinese philosopher, Lao Tzu, said, "A journey of a thousand miles begins with a single step." Take that single step. However helpless we feel when watching the news and however appalled we are at the conduct of leaders, we can start to make a difference where we are.

Jesus said, "If you give even a cup of cold water to one of the least of my followers, you will surely be rewarded." Most of us can manage a cup of cold water. Start where you are and, in this year of prayer, surround your action in prayer. Like the young boy at the 'Feeding of the Five Thousand', put your offering into Jesus's hands and watch him do extraordinary things.

The ringing followed the ceremony at the memorial outside the church when Gareth Jones gave a short epitaph before the Roll of Honour was read by a relative of one of the deceased.

The event was attended by several relatives of the crewmen who all lost their lives in the crash, as well as several villagers and Richard Cole, the High Sheriff of Rutland.

Following the ceremony a delicious tea was served in the village hall where there was an excellent informative display featuring several first-hand accounts of that day 80 years ago which had been curated by the village historian Liz Tyler.

A band of Bell Ringers from Castor then rang a wonderful quarter peal, a truly fitting end to a memorable afternoon.



North Luffenham Good Neighbour Scheme (NLGNS)

What is it all about? The North Luffenham Good Neighbour Scheme (NLGLS) uses volunteers from the village of North Luffenham to provide help for anyone in our Parish who needs assistance.

What kind of help?

Occasional Transport to one-off appointments at the various local hospitals, doctors, opticians or dentists. (there is a mileage cost based on return journeys eg: Stamford £7, Oakham £7.50p Empingham Surgery £4 Peterborough £16.)

Collection of prescription. We can provide regular prescription collection days throughout the month, so give us a call to arrange your collection.

Help with pets. In the event of an emergency or illness, we can provide short term help with your pets. If you are ill or if the weather is too bad for you to venture out, give us a call.

One-off tidy of your garden. If you have been ill and your garden has got on top of you, we can help with a one-off tidy to get it back under control.

Form filling. We can provide help with writing letters or reading to people with visual impairment or the use of email and the internet

Practical support following injury/surgery. If you need any kind of help whilst recuperating from illness, give us a call and we will try and help.

Who can use the North Luffenham Good Neighbour Scheme?

Everyone in the village or the Parish of North Luffenham. The service is open to anyone who doesn't have someone around to help in times of need or who doesn't have access to a car.

How much does it cost? The only cost is for petrol, parking and materials. All other services are **free**.

Donation envelopes are available should anyone wish to contribute to the running costs of the Scheme

Is it safe? All our volunteers have been checked by the Disclosure & Barring Service (DBS) and are fully insured. A volunteer will carry photographic ID that will be produced and the name of the individual will be given to you during the phone call with the volunteer coordinator.

How does it work ? Just call: 07825 697841

A coordinator will arrange for one of our registered volunteers to help. The coordinator will then phone you back to confirm who will be calling and at what time. The coordinator will be taking calls between 8am and 8pm each day. Be prepared to leave a message...
