Seeing things differently

August is a month that brings us 'the summer'... now I don't know about you but I often find myself wondering what that will mean, will it be full on heat of summer, torrential rain, cloudy cool days or all of the above!

We will simply have to wait and see and whatever faces us we will no doubt adapt whatever we are doing to fit the situation as best we can.



This sense of the need to adapt and see things differently brings to mind Bartholomew, one of Jesus 12 disciples, mentioned in the gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke. John's gospel never mentions Bartholomew but does mention Nathanael (the others don't) so many think that Bartholomew and Nathanael are the same person.

I love Nathanael's first encounter with Jesus. Philip comes and tells him about Jesus of Nazareth to which Nathanael replies 'Can anything good come out of Nazareth?' It's a slightly grumpy response, maybe like those hoping for a lovely summer holiday weather in August, he's been let down a few times before.

Still, what happens next is a story of being completely turned around. Jesus tells Nathanael that he saw him under the fig tree before Philip called him. Nathanael is so surprised by this he changes from sceptic to believer, and even more than Philip had said. Nathanael says to Jesus "you are the Son of God! You are the King of Israel."

There are many times when we are sceptical or doubt, but when we meet Jesus for ourselves our outlook can be transformed, when we realise we are known and loved by Jesus it changes everything.

Come rain or shine this August I pray you find some time to meet Jesus in the pages of the Bible, in the family of the church, in a quiet place (like Nathanael's fig tree) where you are seen and loved.

LOROS announces cuts to its services - and a plea for help

As you may have previously heard, LOROS is experiencing severe financial challenges due to a sharp rise in our running costs, a significant drop in gifts from wills and ever-increasing demand for our services.

As a result, we are sadly facing a £2 million shortfall this year, which has forced us to reduce some of our services for patients and families.

- Fewer inpatient beds, reduced to 20 on our inpatient ward.
- Reduced day therapy, running Tuesday-Thursday now.
- Cuts to physiotherapy, occupational therapy, social work, chaplaincy and complementary therapies
- Closure of the Volunteer Home Visiting service.

Camilla Barrow, Acting/interim Chief Executive of LOROS Hospice said: "Like other hospices we are struggling with an incredibly tough financial situation. No hospice wants to be doing less when the need is so great. This is not what our patients deserve and it's not what our community deserves."

"These changes are hugely challenging and we are working closely with all our partners to ensure a smooth transition and to minimise impacts on affected patients.

"We would like to reiterate that if you need our care in Leicester, Leicestershire or Rutland today, **LOROS** is **still here for you**, delivering exceptional care, with the same compassion and skill that have always defined us."

The charity is calling on all its supporters across the counties it serves to stand by it and dig deep in this critical moment.

"Our message to all our supporters is we need you now more than we have ever done. Please show us you need us too."

The Rotary Club of Uppingham has organised a special event in support of **LOROS** - the Eyebrook Walk.

Sunday 17th August 10.00am to 2.00pm

The walk covers a gentle 5 miles of pathway and minor roads around the beautiful Eyebrook Reservoir initially through a limited access Nature Reserve; much of the perimeter is an SSSI. The reservoir is a major trout fishery, an important habitat for water birds of all types and has a historic connection to the Dambusters who practised over its surface prior to the Dams Raid in 1943. The walk will start from the lay-by alongside the reservoir below Stoke Dry between 1000 and 1200 on Sunday 17 Aug and should complete by 1400. Dogs on leads are welcome.

The route lies clockwise round the Eyebrook Reservoir starting from the layby on the side of the reservoir at the foot of the hill below Stoke Dry GR853963 (what3words – compiler.stuns.spoon).




