And Death Shall have no more Dominion



November is, for many, a sombre month which provides the opportunity to pause and reflect on the immense sacrifice of countless brave men and women during times of war or conflict, both here and around the world. It can be, for some, a time of great personal sadness too, in which loved ones are mourned and especially remembered.

This time in late autumn can also contribute to this sense of bleakness, with the occasional gloom of rainy grey skies, the on-going daily reduction of daylight and bare silhouettes of trees beginning to emerge.

But amidst the inevitable 'darkness' of this time of year, I would like to share some lines from that great 20th Century Welsh poet, Dylan Thomas. Many years ago, as a secondary school pupil, I studied his well-known play, 'Under Milk Wood' but it is only very recently that I stumbled across his poem 'And Death Shall have no more Dominion.' I came across it via a YouTube clip of the poet's original sound recording and found his personal rendition both powerful and moving, in equal measure. And as I listened to it, its overwhelmingly positive message lifted my spirits, not least as an 'antidote' to recent acts of war on our national news.The first verse starts with:

'And death shall have no dominion'

And continues with:

'They shall have stars at elbow and foot; Though they go mad they shall be sane, Though they sink through the sea they shall rise again; Though lovers be lost love shall not; And death shall have no dominion.' This extract is from one of Thomas' earliest poems, written after his friend Bert Trick, suggested that they should each try to write a poem on the subject of 'immortality.' When published, it first appeared in 'The New English Weekly' in 1933. It was later included in Dylan Thomas' second collection of poetry, 'Twenty-five Poems.'

You may well recognise the opening line (and title) of the poem however, which clearly has its origins in St Paul's letter to the Romans in the New Testament section of the Bible, in which we read:

"But if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him." (Romans Chapter 9, verses 8 – 9)

For Saint Paul, a famous leader in the early Christian church, there was no doubt: death is not the end. Paul believed that Jesus' resurrection on the first Easter Day demonstrated to the world that God's power rules over everything that exists. And although humanity has continued to suffer through 'man's inhumanity to man' in wars and conflicts down the ages, Christians today continue to experience God's love and power in their own daily lives through the sacrifice and resurrection of Christ.


