Remember, Remember...

Remember, Remember... That is, of course, the beginning of the children's rhyme about the gunpowder plot of 1605.

But Remember is a very good summing up word for the month itself.

November brings us a season of remembering. All Saints followed by All Souls as we remember those who have gone before us. The Saints of old whose lives inspire us in our Christian journey and the local, maybe only known to us, souls who have walked with us in faith.

Remembrance Sunday and Armistice Day call us to remember the horrors of war so that in remembering we might avoid such actions as lead to these tragedies.

November also marks the end of the Church year and as with every time of ending and beginning we remember what has been and we look to what will be. The church year ends with the Sunday before Advent when we remember what is important to us. We keep it as the feast of Christ the King remembering that it is in Jesus Christ that all things are held together, that it is Jesus who the saints follow and it is the sacrifice of Jesus on the cross, laying down his life for us, that inspired those who lay down their life for peace.

That Sunday is also often known as 'Stir up Sunday' from the collect rather than from the Christmas pudding and cake stirring in the kitchen! The Book of Common prayer Collect leads us to pray "Stir up, O Lord, the wills of your faithful people; that they, plenteously bringing forth the fruit of good works, may by you be plenteously rewarded; through Jesus Christ our Lord."

So in this month of November I pray that we will remember...

Those who lived faithful Christian lives (and do so too), those who we love as see no longer (cherishing our loved ones now), those who sacrifice for peace (and commit ourselves to work for peace) and finally Jesus Christ, God who left the glory of heaven to be one of us.

In our remembering may we be inspired to action, to be stirred up, faithful Christian people known for the fruit of Good Works. Amen.


The Village History Display, produced by the Men's Shed is now being displayed in the Rutland Museum in Oakham. It will be there until after Christmas. Please drop in and take a look.



SAFARI SUPPER 2026 Saturday 31 January 2026

Every year Manton hosts a Safari Supper in order to raise money for Church Funds. This is a hugely successful event which involves the whole of the village and a lot of eating, drinking and socialising!!

For those who are new to the village or have not been before this is how it works. Villagers who would like to take part are asked to contact Anne Cowan (737503) in order to book their place and also if possible to offer to host a course. We are likely to be catering for around 65 people, so we need about 10 hosts to offer to do a starter, 10 to do a main course and 10 to do a pudding course. The idea of the evening is that on the day you will be given an envelope telling you where to go for your starter at 7.15pm. After your starter you will be given an envelope telling you where to go next...and so on. It will always be within walking distance and in the village and if you are with a partner you will always be with them, otherwise you will meet different people at different courses until coffee at the end at which time we all meet up in one big house!!

We can cope with simple dietary requirements – **so long as you tell us !!!** and we can cope with a

range of disabilities or access problems, again if they are specified in advance. If you are prepared to be a host for one of the courses you will be given a "Food allowance" per guest – depending on the number of people you cater for – from 4 -

10 is possible! The choice of starters, main course and puddings will be up to the individual hosts to organise. The main course is usually a simple hot meal of the casserole variety served with vegetables. Drinks are not included in your ticket price so please bring all drinks with you.

Glasses will be provided by your hosts.

Tickets this year will be £20 each which includes a three course meal plus coffee and a wonderful opportunity to mix with lots of village people. There are a very few tickets available (about 15) to people who are not able to host a course. You need to book early even if you are offering a course as this is a highly popular event. Please do this before Christmas so that Anne can start work on the logistics of the night!! Don't delay…book today!!! (01572737503 annecowan38@gmail.com)

Watching the weather from 2 weeks out the forecast was not good - breezy with rain - but as the day approached it steadily improved to being cool and sunny with some rain. We only suffered one cloud burst, including hail, early afternoon coming into Edith Weston but were soon sheltering in the village church.

The four of us, Ben, Charlie, Peter and Tony, set off round the water to arrive at the planned start point of St Mary's South Luffenham at 10.00am. After 18 churches south of Rutland Water we returned via Normanton church, St Peters and the Methodist Chapel in Empingham, to Whitwell and a welcome lunch break 45 mins later than the estimated time of 2.30pm. As is customary each church had recorders to sign our record sheets and welcomed us with a variety of refreshments; biscuits, home baked cakes, even sandwiches and flapjacks. Not all necessarily recommended intake for a 'Tour' but enjoyed nonetheless. Whitwell's St Michael and All Angels church received 49 visitors - giving some idea of the numbers participating.

We left Whitwell at about 3.30pm and made the descent into Oakham via St Peter's Exton and Burley on the Hill recording Oakham Congregational Church, our last visit, at 5.43pm. A great day enjoyed by all. Peter, whose family come from this area, especially appreciated the route on small lanes with little or no traffic only briefly touching the major roads and seeing the landscape and villages in far more detail than ever before.

Notably '**Total Ascent 859m'** - we knew about it! Though none had to dismount even on the hard climbs into (65m) and out (57m) of Seaton. The Stamina graph! - tell me something I don't know! Frankly, from my perspective a blessing to still be able to

achieve this aged 71!


