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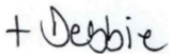
Festival of Creation in Christ

Edith Weston PC currently has several vacancies

Would you like to help to keep Edith Weston a desirable place to live? Are you interested in environmental, planning and development issues that might affect our village? Can you help to be a voice for the people of the Parish?

Edith Weston Parish Councillors:

- Are available for most PC meetings, usually held on the last Monday evening of every second month at 19.15 in the Edith Weston Village Hall.
- Attend occasional consultation events and informative local authority meetings.
- Undertake any actions delegated to them from meetings.
- Receive and respond to emails in between meetings.
- May help with the Village Events etc.

To Be a Councillor you need to:

- Care about getting the best for your community and be willing to represent the views of the village.
- Be a British Citizen of the Commonwealth or the European Union;
- Be 18 years of age or over
- During the preceding 12-month period have resided in the parish council or have lived within 3 miles of the council area for the whole of the 12 months preceding the day of nomination or the day of election
- Not be disqualified from being elected – check with the Clerk for further information.

Councillors are volunteers and therefore they are not paid but can claim some expenses for activities undertaken on behalf of the Council.

The best way to find out what it's like to be a parish councillor is to talk to someone who's doing it now. Come along to a parish council meeting or speak to one of our councillors and find out what they think of the role. Training and support are available for new councillors.

Quiz Night Rings the Changes for Alan's Epic Fundraising Challenge

Lands End to John O'Groats on 3 wheels, 2 arms and 1 leg!



Edith Weston came together for a night of quizzing, laughter and fundraising to support an extraordinary challenge undertaken by local bell-ringer Alan Wordie. Alan, Chair of the Rutland Branch of the Peterborough Diocesan Guild of Church Bell Ringers, has completed an astonishing 900-plus-mile handcycling journey from Land's End to John O'Groats.

Following a full leg amputation after an accident many years ago, Alan took on the challenge in his 70th year with an ambitious goal — to raise £70,000 for the Motor Neurone Disease Association.

His epic journey certainly wasn't without its challenges. It began in record-breaking high temperatures, while the latter stages saw Alan battling some decidedly less welcoming weather,

including heavy rain. Outriders accompanied him on all but two days, when Alan tackled the route alone.

Inspired by Alan's determination and achievement, the Edith Weston branch organised a quiz evening at the Village Hall to help boost his fundraising total. *Thank you Nicky, Peter (quizmasters) & Bell Ringing team.*

By the end of the evening, an impressive £1,238 had been raised for the Motor Neurone Disease Association — a fantastic result and a fitting tribute to Alan's remarkable achievement.

The Edith Weston Bell Ringers are certainly keeping the bells ringing, too. The group continues to enjoy practice sessions on selected Monday evenings and can be heard ringing for special events in the village.

With Alan's epic journey complete, the bells of Edith Weston have certainly helped celebrate his success — and raised a very impressive sum for a most worthwhile cause.

News from St Peter's Church

SAVE YOUR CHURCH FROM CLOSING

St Peter's Church will close permanently without your support.

There has been a church in Empingham since Norman times and the current building dates from the mid 13th Century. Generations of families have worshipped here, been baptised, married and buried here. Look at the war memorial inside the church and you will see the names of families who are still connected with Empingham today.

St Peter's is open 7 days a week for visitors and to welcome villagers for services, coffee mornings, concerts, even a fashion show. However, it is facing permanent closure due to the rising costs of running the church and maintaining the building.

St Peter's will end this year (2026) almost **£12000** in the red – £1000 for every month! We must increase our regular, planned income by at least this amount to break even. Without regular and dependable support, there's a real danger the church will close permanently. **This is reality.**

If you don't want to see our village lose its beautiful, Grade I listed church, please give us your support. St Peter's can only be saved by the whole community coming together.

SPEED WATCH

A Community Speed watch program was carried out along Edith Weston Road from CSW 3rd July 2026 – 17th July 2026.

Two sites were monitored, for one hour, a.m. and p.m. each day. Speeds of 36 miles and above were recorded. The details of 290 vehicles were taken resulting in 176 letters sent.
